

Bearded Vulture European Endangered Species Program (EEP)

Criteria for new applicants

April 2015

1. Flight shows:

- Institution without flight shows have priority
- Institutions having other endangered (CR, END or VU) vultures in their flight shows will have lower priority
- Institutions flying Bearded Vultures in their flight shows will be rejected

2. Housing conditions of birds and other species:

Institution housing birds and other species according EAZA guidelines have priority

3. Vulture conservation:

Institutions with ongoing conservation programs with other vultures species have priority

4. Other Conservation Programs:

Institution directly engaged in conservation programs with other species have priority

5. Outreach programs:

Institution with a high performance in relation to education programs have priority

6. Bearded Vulture ownership:

Institution that contact the VCF to acquire Bearded Vultures (rather than via other routes) have priority

7. Additional benefits for the breeding vulture program

Institutions which provide additional benefit for the breeding program have priority (e.g. providing new founder lines from unrecoverable birds for release, extend the breeding network and/or promoting vulture conservation in new areas or regions of high priority for the conservation of Bearded Vultures)



NEW APPLICANTS will receive birds

- 1. When the housing conditions are accord to the EEP guidelines
- 2. When the EEP collaboration agreement between new Applicant and VCF is signed
